Laws relevant to certifiers



Current laws relevant to certifiers will be incorporated into the new Building Act

Building and Development Certifiers Act 2018

The BDC Act sets out the registration of certifiers and regulates the occupation.

This is complemented with the Code of Conduct and Practice Standards to aid compliance and clarify obligations.

Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979

The EPA Act sets out the building approval process, including inspections and various certificates such as compliance, construction and occupation certificates.

Future Building Act

The BDC Act and parts of the EPA Act are to be modernised and amalgamated into the Building Act.

This aims to make it easier and simpler to understand the rules and obligations in line with DBP, fire safety and other relevant frameworks.








Chain of Responsibility
